

## INUVIALUIT CHILD REGISTRATION

Did you know you can register your child with the Inuvialuit Regional Corporation Enrolment team even if you are born outside of the Inuvialuit Settlement Region?

Who can be registered:

- Any child under 18 with one or more Inuvialuit parents or grandparents.
- Young persons living inside or outside the ISR.
- Young persons from families with Inuvialuit and other Indigenous heritage (Gwich'in, etc.)

Why you should register your child or grandchild:

- Inuvialuit children are not automatically registered at birth.
- Get access to IRC children's programs.
- Become eligible for student loans through the Inuvialuit Education Fund.
- Qualify for Heath Canada and Non-Insured Health Benefits.
- Automatically receive an enrolment application when your child turns 18.
- Registration verifies a child/youth is Inuvialuit, Inuit, and Indigenous for their rights and services in Canada, including the Inuit Child First Initiative.
- Children and youth can register at any point before they turn 18. After 18 they may qualify for enrolment.
- Registering confirms your Inuvialuit identity and opens new opportunities for support.
